

THSTI -PGIMER sign an MoU for collaborative research

New Delhi, February 06: Translational Health Science And Technology Institute (THSTI), Faridabad has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh to initiate collaborations in research, product development, process development and capacity building in areas spanning but not limited to;

- a) Vaccines and Infectious Diseases
- b) Maternal and Child Health
- c) Point of care and *in vitro* diagnostics
- d) Metabolic diseases and nutrition
- e) Training in Clinical and Product development

To identify mutual areas of collaboration and interest, clinicians and researchers from PGIMER working in the area of Vaccines and Infectious Diseases visited THSTI on the 28th of January 2020. Kickstarting what is going to be a series of interactions between the two partnering institutions, participants from both the sides expressed their willingness to begin conversations that will be directed at identifying problems of medicine of mutual interest and benefit, and then initiating programmes of research and training.
