Scientist NCPOR, MoES Awarded for the 2020 Asian Polar Science Fellowship under the category of Established Polar Scientists

Dr. Avnish Kumar, Scientist of National Center for Polar and Ocean Research (NCPOR), Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES), Government of India, has become one of the first Indian Polar Scientists to receive the prestigious award from Korea Polar Research Institute (KOPRI) Asian Polar Science Fellowship 2020. He has received the Fellowship for his research proposal under the category of the stabilized scientist on “Mechanism of Changes in the Arctic sea-ice and its Possible Connections with the Lower Latitudes Weather Pattern”. His present research work is to identify the uncertainty regarding the comprehensive mechanism of changes in the Arctic sea and its interaction from the ocean-atmosphere couple.

The main objective of the Asian Polar Science Fellowship Program is to promote Asian research cooperation and to provide the future generation of polar scientists with networking and research opportunities, using their expanding infrastructure and capacity. His research work would help to establish long-term collaborative research between NCPOR, India, and KOPRI, South Korea, and to establish model-based studies and identify links between Arctic warming and Asian extreme weather conditions.
