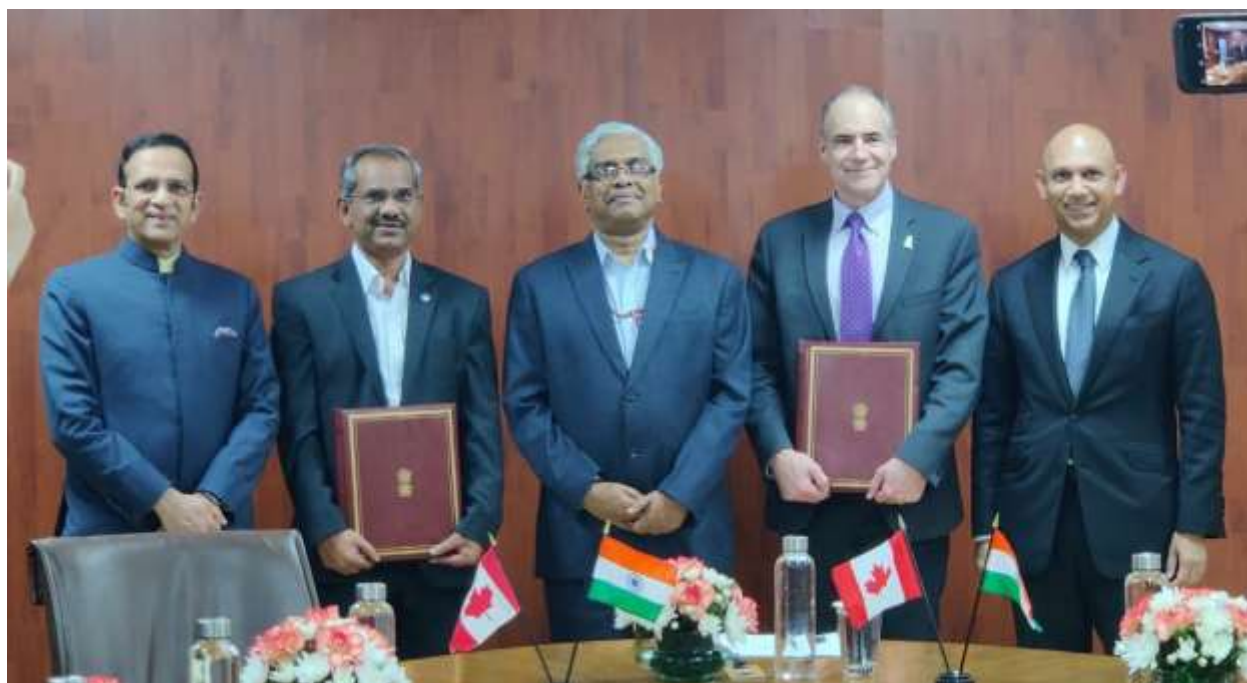


NCPOR signs MoU with Canadian High Arctic Research Station on Polar Research

National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research (NCPOR), Ministry of Earth Sciences, Government of India signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with the Canadian High Arctic Research Station (CHARS) for research on polar science. India is a polar nation that has been studying the Antarctic for years and becoming increasingly active in the Arctic.



President and CEO of Polar Knowledge Canada, David Scott, said the Canadian Antarctic research community is exploring the possibilities of collaborative opportunities with the Indian Antarctic programme. He also informed that presently two stations are operating in the Antarctic region.

He also said that during the northern summer (June-August) he would be working with several Indian scientists in the Canadian Arctic. He stated that they were extremely happy to collaborate with the experienced scientists at the NCPOR campus which is well equipped with the latest analytical machinery and experts at multiple levels in gaining detailed polar knowledge.
