

COVID-19 transition rate in India slowed down after lockdown

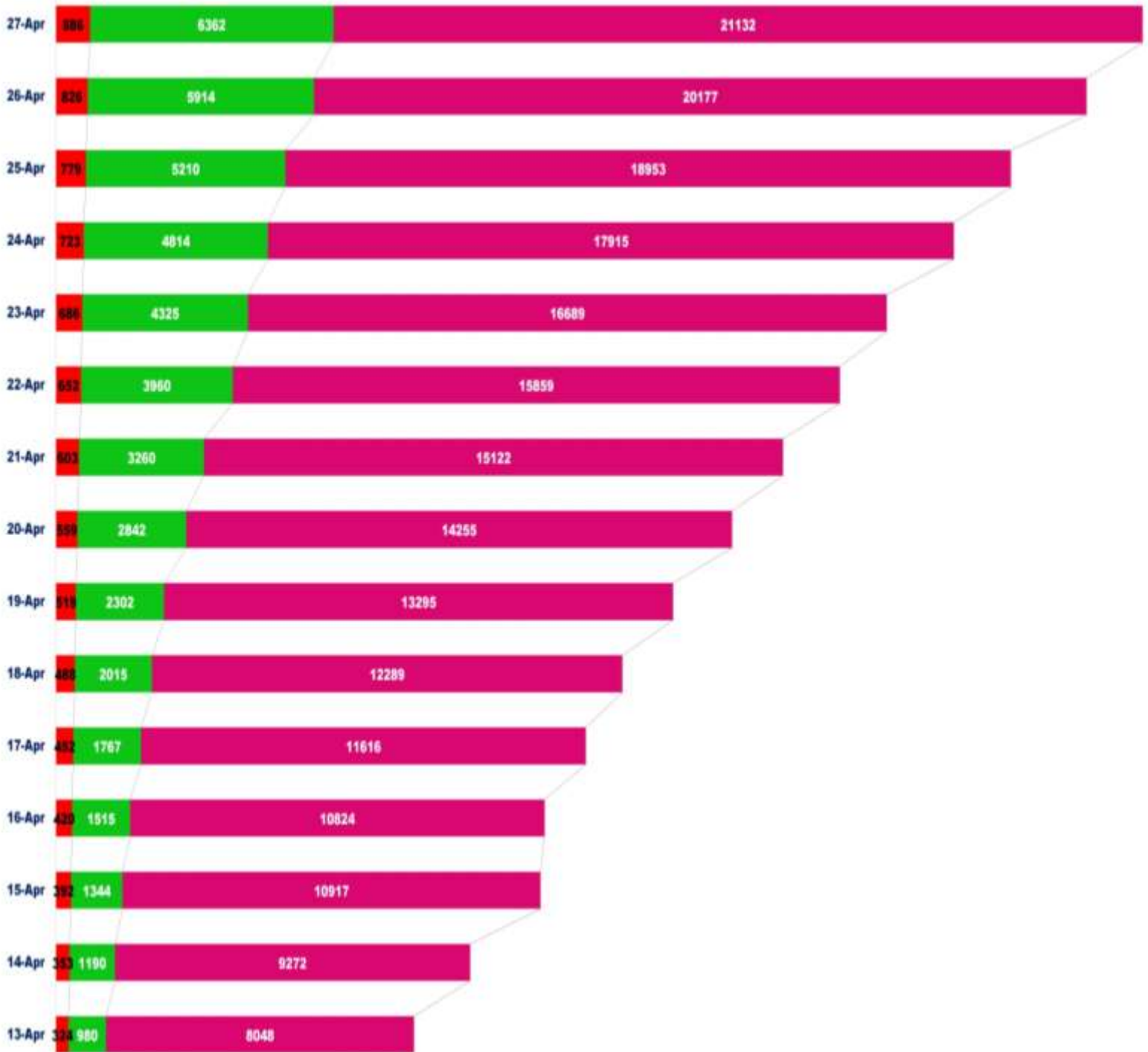
The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) stated that the situation is "currently stable" and that the growth of infections is more or less linear and not exponential, indicating that the strategies adopted for transitioning to a particular level have been successful. The reduction in growth rate was found after the lockdown and has proved to be effective. This has helped India reach a better position than the rest of the world. In another positive development, officials said that despite a 24-fold increase in tests, the percentage of positive cases has not increased. The percentage of positive cases as a proportion of tests is more or less the same as it was a month ago.

The Union Health Ministry has recorded 1396 new positive cases in the last 24 hours, taking the total confirmed cases to 28,380. Presently 21132 people are under active medical supervision and 381 patients have recovered in the last 1 day. The total number of people recovered is 6,362. The recovery rate is 22.17 per cent. In 85 districts no new cases have been registered in the last 15 days.
